**NON FORMAL SANSKRIT CLASSES**

In session 2016-17 college organized Non formal Sanskrit classes (NFSE) sponsored by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan under MHRD which works for the development, preservation and promotion of Sanskrit learning all over the country and abroad. Dr.Vinod Kumar Asstt. Prof.(Sanskrit) has been appointed as Center Authorised Officer for this programme. 30 students including 8 faculty members were registered in the course “Prathma Diksha” under NFSE facilitator Aacharya Sushant Sharma. We feel proud to make our college a part of this Sanskrit revolution.

COLLEGE LIBRARY:

A well-equipped library is a store-house of knowledge. It plays a vital role in promoting the knowledge. There are about 2000 books in our library pertaining to various fields of education. Reading Hall is equipped with computers having Internet facility for students to have access to various e-resources. Library has INFLIBNET facility. Besides six daily news papers, seven monthly magazines and four journals- Arthshshtra, Indian Journal of Finance, Indian Journal of Management Prabandhan and Indian journal of Marketing library also has subscription to many online books and journals. The library has been computerized and Internet facility has been made available for the use of Teachers and Students.

SPORTS

Sh. Pawan Kumar, Assistant Professor in Economics deserves full appreciation as he held the additional charge of sports as there is no post of Physical Education in the college. In the academic session 2016-17, the college participated in various Inter college Sports events. The students participated in X-country, Cricket, Volleyball, Badminton and Kabaddi in which Volleyball and Kabaddi teams performed well and played quarter final matches.

The 6th Annual Athletic Meet of the college was organized on Dec. 15, 2016 in which 126 students participated in various activities. The students performed actively in 100 & 200 meter race, Long Jump/High

Jump, Discus Throw/Javelin throw and fun games like Tug of war, Three leg race, Marble race and Sack Race.

SCHOLARSHIP

Meritorious students, Girls students and students belonging to IRDP families avail scholarship through Directorate of Higher Education HP under different state sponsored schemes. The scholarship committee makes available all the necessary information to the students to apply online through the web portal HPepass. Besides, central govt. sponsored post-matric SC/ST/ OBC scholarship scheme are also playing a significant role in the academic career of poor students. In the current session around 190 scholarship applications have been verified by the institution under various schemes.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS) :

There are 100 NSS volunteers this year offering their services during various social, cultural and academic activities. Under the guidance of NSS Programme Officer Dr. Arti. activities like plantation of medical plants such as Harad, Amla, Behda etc. on “Van Mahotsav”, social rally on National communal Harmony day 20-01-17 and cleanliness drives were carried out during this session. A seven days special NSS Camp was organized from 26-01-2017 to 01-02-2017 in the college campus in which 50 NSS volunteers participated actively. Various social, educational, Cultural and physical activities and guest lecturers were organized during this seven days camp. Volunteers carried out the cleanliness drive in Thandi Khui near Shiva Temple and the “baawdi” near college campus. “Girl-Child Day” and “Voter’s Day” were also celebrated during the camp. Poster making, Quiz, Poetry reciting Competition were organized. B.D.O. Bangana Sh. Arvind Guleria, Bank Official Sh. Rajesh Sharma, Traffic Incharge Sh. RED RIBBON CLUB

ECO CLUB:

Assistant Professor Sanjay Kumar, Department of Botany, president of the club and its members have the responsibility to make the Campus Green and encourage the students to make environment pollution free. Plantation drive was initiated by the students in the rainy season to prevent the soil erosion from the campus. The Club celebrated International Ozone Day on Sept.16, 2016. Prof. Sanjay presented a Power Point Presentation --“Conserve Water” to sensitize students on the occasion of International Water Day on March 23, 2017. Kavita chaudhary a student of B.Sc Botony was awarded the Trophy of Best Volunteer of session 2016-17.

WOMEN GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

In order to empower girl students and give voice to their grievances, the college has constituted a women grievance cell. Any kind of grievance of any nature is heard and given a prompt redressal by the cell. In the current session, Prof. Anu Attri is the convener of this committee with all the women teaching faculty as members. The committee conducts awareness sessions and general meetings to spread awareness about the women rights at institutions and workplaces. So far no complaint for any kind of harassment is not registered with the committee.

CAREER COUNSELLING AND PLACEMENT CELL:

The objective of Career Counseling and Placement cell is to counsel, guide and provide information about avenues in higher education and job opportunities to the student community. With avid efforts of the Coordinator of this cell, Prof. Sanjay Sharma, the college students are informed about the jobs and career prospects through advertisements on notice board and counseling sessions. An Informative lecture regarding fresh opportunities in different fields was organized on Feb. 22, 2017. The cell also organized an aptitude test sponsored by the newspaper Amar Ujala on March 15, 2017 to give students exposure to changing patterns of competitive exams.

INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT UNDER RUSA:

The college had been selected among 25 colleges of the state for infrastructure grant of Rs 2 crores under Rashtriya Uchta Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA). A staggering sum of Rs 1 crore has been utilized in this session to provide various facilities to the students. First installment of Rs. 22,50,000 was utilized for establishment of Language Lab, Conference Hall, 03 modern Hi-Tech class rooms with interactive boards, Digital Podium and LCD Projectors, gymnasium, Digital notice boards, installation of Photostat Machine for the students and furniture for Library and staff room. Office and Library have been provided softwares to keep the data of students and make fee collection of students easier. The second installment of Rs.27,50,000 was utilized for new construction and renovation of the building. CCTV cameras, intercom and Public Address

system were installed. The whole campus is covered with Wi-Fi facility. Third installment of Rs. 43,05,000 was utilized for construction, renovation and equipments for science labs, music instruments, books and furniture for the library. The Departments of Music, Commerce, Science, Languages and Humanities have been provided computers with internet facility.

A grant 2 Lakhs 94,484 rupees has been received under gender equity component. This grant has been utilized in providing furniture and facility of indoor games in Girl's common room, Remedial classes and scholarship for the financially weak, SC,ST,OBC, Minority and IRDP students .

ICT LAB:

ICT LAB has been established in the college to provide education in information technology and computers to the students. The lab has been established at the cost of Rs 10.5 lakhs provided by the Directorate of Higher Education. Students gain hands -on- practice in the lab which is essential to master IT skills.

UGC & NAAC STATUS:

NAAC Team also visited the college in Feb. 2016 and it gives me immense satisfaction to announce that college has been accredited with 'B' Grade'. NAAC Peer team with chairperson Prof. Hari Mohan, Vice Chancellor J.S. University , members Prof. Y.Prameela Devi and Dr. Siddheshwar Tukaram Gadade visited the college campus and evaluated the institution on various criteria. The team identified the institution *as one of the premier government colleges in the rural area with sufficient scope for further expansion*. I extend heartiest congratulations to all the staff members, students, PTA members, OSA members for their efforts in this direction. The college has also applied for affiliation from UGC under section 2 & 12 B so that college is eligible to receive grants directly from UGC. The process of affiliation is under progress and we hope to complete the process as early as possible.

SELF FINANCE COURSE UNDER HEIS:

Our college has started self job oriented courses such as BCA and BBA under self finance scheme. Higher Education Institute Society (HEIS) has been formed to run such courses. The H.P University has granted affiliation to BBA & BCA and allocated 40 seats in each course to our college. A well equipped computer lab

with internet facility has been established for Department of Computer Applications. Library facility and other facilities have also been provided to these students.

OUR REQUIREMENTS:

Though the institution has come a long way in the past ten years, but there are still “miles to go”. In order to provide holistic education, it is imperative to adopt a prudent approach. The college has lined up some projects for the future which are important for its overall development. The new administrative block is under construction. A well furnished play ground is urgently required to provide sports facilities to students. A students centre/Canteen is also required in this institution. Some progress has been made in this direction with the help of funds provided by SC Sub plan and RUSA grant. A sum of Rs. 35 Lakh has already been deposited with PWD Department. Due to retirements and various other reasons there is a paucity of staff in the teaching as well as administrative department. The existing staff strength is inadequate and more posts are required to be created to cater to the growing strength of students.

CONCLUSION

On this occasion I take this opportunity to extend my thanks to the District Administration, various Govt. Departments, Media, Social organizations and distinguished personalities for their invaluable support.
